In contrast, others cited evidence that programs based on positive reinforcement alone were sometimes not effective in treating severe problems.

These researchers and practitioners desired to ensure that clients and guardians be permitted to choose treatments that included punishment procedures when assessments warranted their use. The first editor approached Ogden Lindsley, president of ABA, about establishing a task force to examine this issue. The ABA council decided to broaden the mandate to include an examination of clients' right to effective behavioral treatment in general. The first editor was asked to chair the task force and appointed Saul Axelrod, Jon S. Bailey, Judith E. Favell, Richard M. Foxx, and O. Ivar Lovaas as members. Brian A. Iwata was appointed liaison by the ABA council.
